Project to establish a technical landfill site at Danford Lake in the Municipality of Allevyn-et-Cawood

Ms. Claudette Journault, Chair

Claudette Journault trained as a biologist and worked from 1973 to 1989 at the Service de la protection de l'environnement du Québec where, among other duties, she was responsible for the inventory and description of hazardous waste disposal sites in Québec. She has acted as co-chair of the Comité consultatif sur l'agriculture et les ressources naturelles at Radio-Canada, and as president of the Association des biologistes du Québec.

As a member of the BAPE since 1989, Claudette Journault has signed 42 reports. She has chaired 26 public hearing commissions, including the commission that examined the enlargement of the Sainte-Sophie technical landfill, and the question of waste management in Québec. She has also supervised several environmental mediations.

Mr. Donald Labrie, Commissioner

Mr. Labrie graduated in Chemical Engineering from l'Université Laval, and in Environment Engineering from l'École polytechnique in Montréal. After a career in the public sector, he became president of Envirobec inc., a consulting firm in environment, and acted as vice-president, environment, for Roche ltée, Groupe-conseil.

From 1998 to 2005, Mr. Labrie was a consultant in the development and carrying out of environmental projects nationally and internationally. Since his nomination as a part-time member for the BAPE in 1997, he sat as commissioner on five public hearings including the project of the Suroît combined cycle powerplant. Mr. Labrie also chaired the public hearing commission on the redevelopment of route 185 in Rivière-du-Loup and Saint-Antonin.
